
Iowa Memorial Union (University of Iowa campus), Iowa City

- o Collective Bargaining Law: Legal basis for bargaining rights; what happens at impasse?
- Bargaining Basics: Drafting contract language, costing proposals, making persuasive arguments, making effective use of mediators
- Maximizing Your Power: How can you make the best use of your strengths, your members, your allies and your community, to get the best contract?
- Bargaining Simulation: Each participant will get an opportunity to practice bargaining skills in a realistic bargaining simulation
